



The Clinton Board of Education (the “Board”) understands the importance of parents and students understanding the manner in which grade point averages are calculated within the Clinton Public Schools (the “District”). In accordance with Connecticut law, this policy shall explain the manner in which grade point averages are calculated within the District.

The Board believes that, due to the rigorous nature of certain classes, the grades earned in such classes deserve additional weight for the purposes of calculating grade point average and determining class rank. These rigorous classes include the following: Honors, Advanced Placement (AP) and Early College Experience (ECE). Therefore, it is the policy of the Board of Education to grant grades earned in such courses additional weight for the aforementioned purposes. The Superintendent or his/her designee shall be responsible for developing procedures in furtherance of this policy.

Calculating Grade Point Average

For the purpose of calculating grade point average, beginning with the Class of 2024, the chart below represents the grading scale and GPA credit assignment for high school courses.

All final course grades will carry the GPA credit as shown in the table. Due to the rigorous nature of courses designated as Honors, Advanced Placement (AP) or Early College Experience (ECE), additional weighting will be applied:

- All Honors courses will receive an additional weighting factor of 0.5.
- All AP or ECE courses will receive an additional weighting factor of 1.0.
